The 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time: "I was traveling recently and watched as a wife led her blind husband onto the plane by her arm. She lovingly helped him into his seat and made sure he was comfortable. She placed their bags above in the bin and then sat next to him. They were ready for the flight. As I sat in my seat just a few rows away, I wondered what he would do if she ever left his side. Sometimes those we love in our life can be blind, and we need to be their eyes. They aren't physically blind, but they are unable to see the truth about their life, situation, or needs. We need to lend them our sight and insight, or they will remain in their world of darkness. Jesus asked his disciples, "Can a blind person guide a blind person?" If we aren't actively working to be sure that we can see clearly, what will we be able to offer someone we care about when they come to us with their blindness? Can you lead someone to Christ if you aren't living a life with him yourself? Can you share with another truth if you aren't concerned with knowing the truth yourself? Life is not always easy. Without faith, hope, and love, the road can be too hard to travel. We are not created to be alone. Instead, we are created to be traveling companions. However, the blind cannot lead the blind. May the Light of Christ dispel your darkness and give you sight so that when the call comes, you might lend an arm to lead the blind.



PASTORS CORNER

In our Liturgy today, we celebrate the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time. and that is only for three days. Then we begin the Sacred Season of Lent on Wednesday, Ash Wednesday. In today's first 1st reading from Sirach, we have two declarations that lead us right into the Lenten Season. First the prophet reminds us that tribulation is the test of the just. Secondly, the fruit that the tree bears

indicates what kind of care it received. Lent is that time, the time as the Prophet Joel reminds us, the Lord wants us to return to Him with our whole heart. In the gospel Jesus shares a parable with the Apostles and they in turn handed it on to us, the faith community, challenging us to realize that generosity, prayer and sacrifice are three, (3) of the most enriching and cultivating experiences of our life. With these we bear good fruit, because they nourish, cultivate and nurture our Spirit to bear good fruit.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes, reminding us that we are dust and unto dust we shall return, but our spirit lives on. In Lent, our focus should be on the challenging experiences presented to us in today's gospel, generosity, prayer and sacrifice. Together the fruit they produce is unselfishness. Unselfishness produces service. Service produces commitment. Commitment produces the bond of what one says equals what one does. LENTEN REGULATIONS for Fasting & Abstinence

- Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence
- In Addition: <u>ALL</u> Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (NO Meat)
- For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59
- When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal as well a two smaller meal that together are not equal to one full meal
- The norms concerning abstinences from *meat* are binding on members ages 14 & older
- In closing, members of the Catholic Church are asked to undertake a "Special Penance & Abstinence" befitting their own personal spirituality to enhance their spiritual growth during this Lenten season!
